Dear Parents/Guardians,

	In School Learning	Home Learning
English	Last week, students created character descriptions of the Minotaur and began planning their own innovation of this myth.	Character description Using the picture in your homework book, first create a word bank of adventurous adjectives and adverbs to describe the character. Then, use your word bank to create a description of them.
Maths	Last week, students began exploring what factors and multiples are and how to find them. They identified common factors and common multiples of two or more numbers.	MyiMaths Times table practice, focusing on 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 10 times tables. If you find any of these difficult, you should focus your practising on this. Science	Students will review their science learning term in QaD summative assessments.	No science tasks assigned this week.
Integrated Curriculum	Students will be preparing for our museum, considering how best to showcase their knowledge. They will also begin creating sculptures of Roman Soldiers using Modroc, inspired by the artist Doug Hyde.	Research project (2 weeks): Continuing from last week's optional task, select an area of Roman history which interests you e.g. Gladiators, education, language, architecture, army, Gods, clothing, daily life. Research this topic using books (there are lots in our school library) or the internet. Create a Powerpoint presentation to share this knowledge. If you do not have access to Powerpoint, you could use another computer program or create an information poster by hand (maximum A3 size).
